

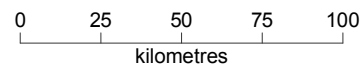


Philippines Typhoon Haiyan (Yolanda) Situational Information (as of 26-Nov-2013 / 06:00)

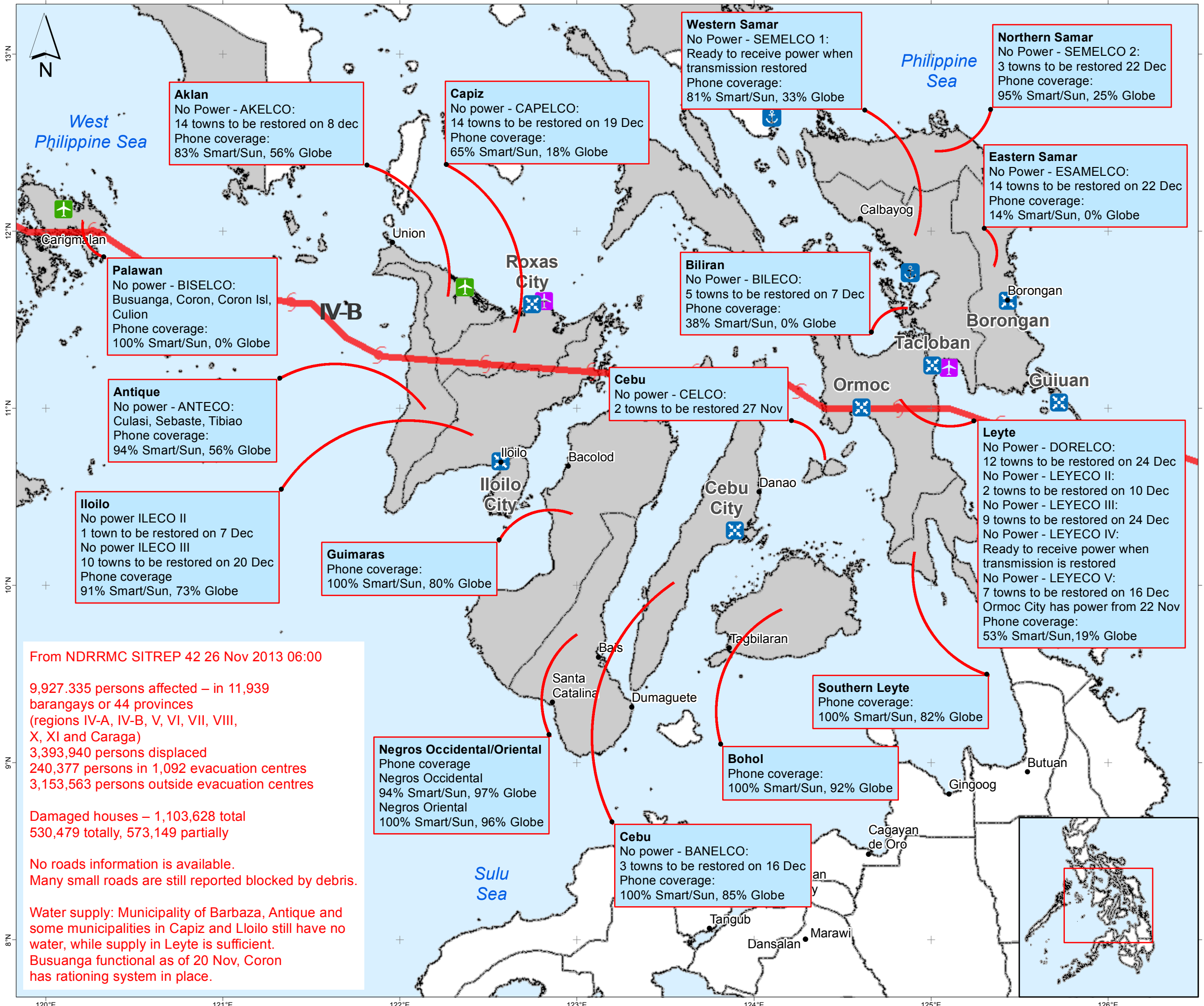
