**Crisis in Sindh at a Glance**

- An estimated 4,158,160 million people affected
- A total area of 27,586 sq km ravaged by floods; 9,927 sq km of crops lost or flood damaged
- Over 470,910 homes destroyed or damaged; an estimated 4,029 schools used as shelters

| <b>Shelter and NFIs</b>     | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Shelter: 7,786 tents and 33,668 tarpaulins covering an estimated 122,820 households (about 172,340 people) in Sindh with supplies in the pipeline for approx. 108,710 people.</li> <li>▪ NFIs: 20,112 kitchen sets, 115,600 bedding, 51,932 blankets, 28,308 jerry cans and 20,520 buckets.</li> </ul>  |
| <b>Water and Sanitation</b> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Access to clean drinking water for 115,000 people every day in Sindh through tankering, hand pumps and water purification tablets or sachets (a minimum 3.5 to 5 litres per person per day for drinking).</li> <li>▪ Hygiene kits (including feminine hygiene products) and soap for nearly 12,000 people in Sindh. Hygiene promotion committees established in 130 camps. Five key messages for diarrhea control campaign and training to begin soon for lady health workers.</li> </ul> |
