

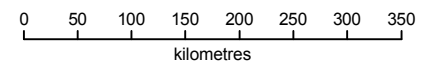

 4. Remaining raster is then plotted as shown

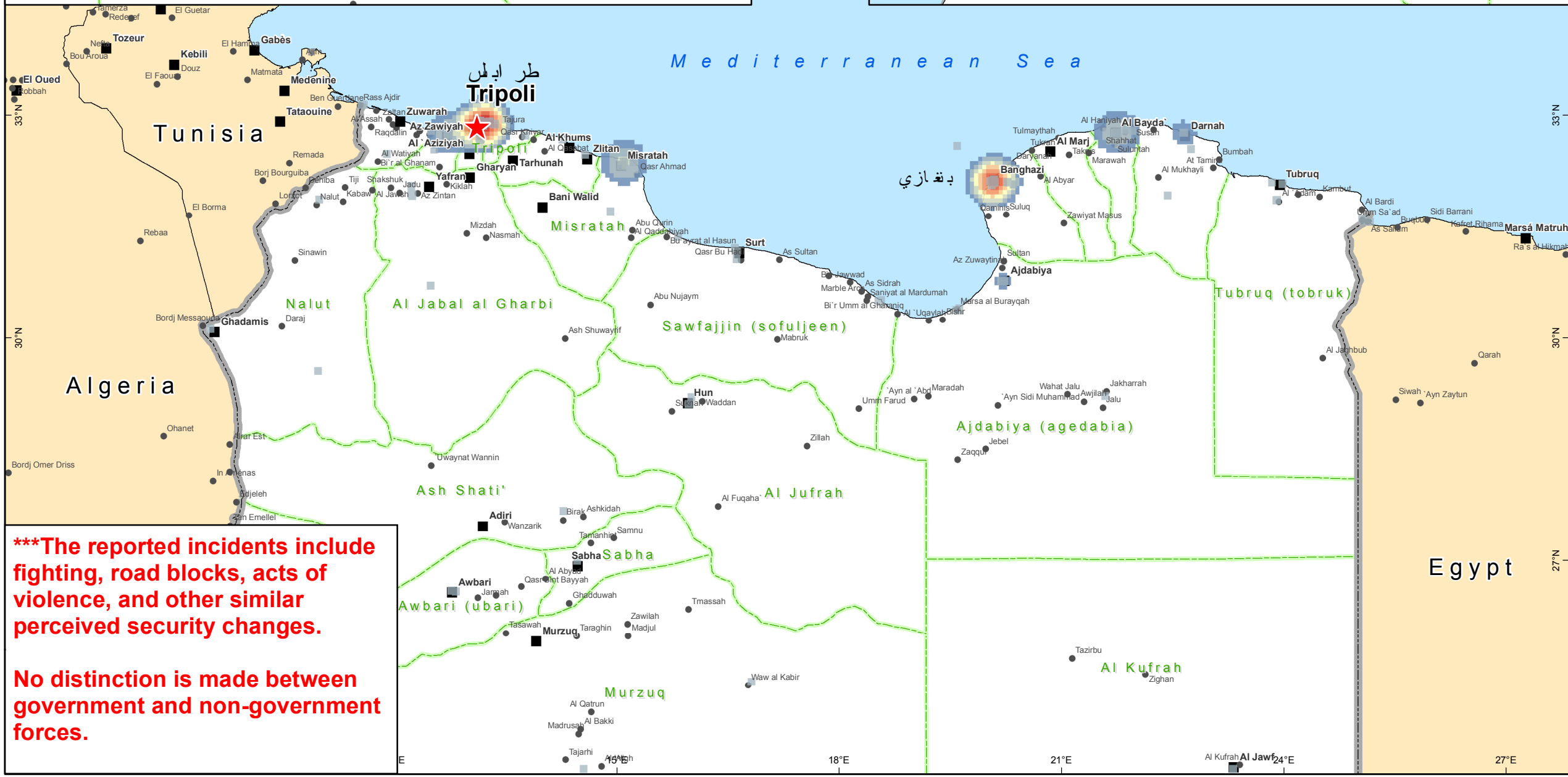
